

Making a Difference

Making a Difference is a course for carers from Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) communities intended to help empower them to become engaged and involved in local, regional and national policy making.

What is the nature of this course?

This course will be run in Leicester over a period of six weeks. It will be for people who are carers for a family member and who come from a black and minority ethnic community. The course will equip you to become involved in local, regional and national forums that contribute to better service provision for BME Carers.

It will be the first pilot course run by the National Black Carers & Carers Workers Network. It will run in the East Midlands and therefore BME carers in Leicester, Derby, Nottingham, Northampton and Lincoln are invited to apply.

This course has been accredited through the Open College Network and therefore all successful participants will be given a certificate which is level 4.

What is the National Black Carers & Carers Workers Network?

The National Black Carers and Carers Workers Network (NBCCWN) was launched in 1998 and aims to develop and maintain an effective network of BME carers and carers workers to facilitate the voice of BME carers. This voice is implemented to improve services, policies and practice both locally and nationally to meet the evolving needs of BME carers.

What is the process for coming on this course?

If you are interested, please fill in the application form that comes with this explanation. We will go through the application forms and ask the successful carers to come for a face to face meeting. This meeting will be an opportunity for you to ask any questions you may have and give us an opportunity to meet you. There will be no charge for the course and all travel and respite costs will be met by our organisation.
